I attended my second IBS Australasian Region conference in December 2011, and I was as impressed in Kiama as I was in Taupo. Many delegates echoed this pleasure throughout the meeting; indeed, the only complaint I heard was about the weather. Even that may have turned out well, though, since it kept people inside to enjoy the talks rather than being distracted by the blowholes. There was a good turnout of about 110 attendees, mostly local (Aus and NZ) but with many delegates from further away as well. This diversity carried over to the keynote speakers, who represented not only various parts of Australia but the USA (via Spain), the UK, Germany and the UK via Kiama itself!

There was something for everyone in the sessions, with talks focused on design and methodology, surveys and surveillance, ecology and genomics. Personally my interests lie in the areas of statistical genetics and agricultural informatics, and just those two areas kept me occupied the majority of the time! I particularly

enjoyed the new "Biometrics showcase" initiative by Russell Millar (Chair), which featured (invited) speakers who had recently published in the society's flagship journal.

To finish off the conference, we all attended the conference dinner at the Mercure resort nearby in Gerringong, where good food, drinks and laughter were present in abundance. After dinner, inaugural ALF awards were presented to Sue Wilson and Arthur Gilmour for their longtime service to the society in particular and the discipline of biometrics in general. The award name refers both to the awardees' status as "Longtime Fellows/Friends" and the region's first vice-president, E.A. 'Alf' Cornish. The speeches by Alan Welsh and Brian Cullis in honour of the recipients provided entertainment as well as well-deserved recognition of their many accomplishments and contributions.

The ALF award is a new award that was proposed and approved by Regional Council and supported unanimously by the members at the general meeting on December 7, 2011. At the conference dinner that evening 'like a night at the Oscars!', Susan R Wilson and Arthur R Gilmour were honoured as the first recipients of the award. A gift in the form of a pewter goblet (later engraved) was presented to each of the recipients.

Alan Welsh (Godfather 1) presented the speech of tribute for Sue echoing her many achievements of Sue (including IBS President 1998-1990, overseeing the establishment of the SUSAN group in Africa) and her immense work with students and researchers in teaching and training of Biometry and Applied Statistics, with an eye to introducing new topics to applied fields.

Brian Cullis (Godfather 2) presented a witty resume from Robin Thompson on the easy-going and 'missionary' style of Arthur, whose computational development of the 'ASReml'

software, has improved the fitting of linear mixed models, providing tools to perform 'spatial or weighted adjustment' of trials from researchers in animal and/or plant breeding all over the world.
